ABOUT MUSTARD

Mustard is an organisation that exists to transform lives through Jesus in schools. We do this through our Student Movement consisting of student-led Lunchtime Groups, and our Schools Programs that are aimed at exploring faith and life in big group presentations.

Mustard Student Movement

The Mustard Student Movement is a movement of young people committed to living out their faith at school. The primary expression of the Student Movement is through Lunchtime Groups, where communities of Christian students gather together weekly, explore ideas of faith and life, and encourage one another to live it out in action. Mustard recruits Student Leaders to run these Lunchtime Groups and then we empower, equip and encourage them to be leaders for Jesus in their schools.

Schools Programs

Mustard's Schools Programs are big group presentations which may be in the form of a chapel service, an extended presentation with discussion or a program that is integrated into a faith week. We take the cultural norms young people face today – from mental health to social media to identity and present them with a Christian world view. The goal is to

involve the Lunchtime Group from the school or other Christians, so that students have a Christian connection in the school after the program is over.

ABOUT THE POSITION

Student Support Co-ordinator

The primary role of the Student Support Coordinator is to work with the Student Movement Director to grow and support Lunchtime Groups in schools.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Visit churches and youth groups, camps and conferences to inspire and recruit new Student Leaders to run Lunchtime Groups in schools
- Manage and participate in the support given to Student Leaders, including communicating with leaders, visiting Lunchtime Groups, mentoring leaders, pastoral care, referring resources and facilitating networking opportunities
- Develop and help organise Student Movement Leader training opportunities and events including Zoom meetings, conferences and workshops
- Provide organisational support to the Student Movement Director
- Connect with local Christian organisations and churches to build financial and prayer support, including commissioning of students in services
- Engage with youth and adults at external events, including church events, camps, and conferences with the aim of promoting the work of Mustard
- Visit churches and youth groups, camps and conferences to inspire and recruit new Student Leaders to run Lunchtime Groups in schools
- Utilise your personal network to build new connections with schools, churches and donors
- Be a key participant in fundraising and supporter events
